

First Ladies of the United States Presidencies

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Process

Each group will chose one First Lady from the following list stated in the Task explanation. Each group is responsible for assigning a role to each group member. The following roles are:

Note: All members are responsible for contributing at least one piece of information toward the combined research of the individual in addition to the duties of their assigned role.

secretary- compiling all of the research information and organizing it in a fashion that can be easily accessible to the group.

graphic artist- finding pictures, videos, and other visual sources such as memorabilia, that will enhance the presentation as a whole.

Note: Any video sources used must be approved before the final presentation.

author- responsible for taking final compiled information and processing it into a visual document of some sort. Also responsible for final grammatical and formating characteristics.

Note: All members of the group are responsible for deciding what information to include in the presentation, what the overall opinions are going to be, and also what the format of the presentation and final outcome is going to be.

Each group member is also responsible for the communication and task management of the group, as well as evaluating each other on their overall contribution to the group.

Step Two- After the roles are assigned within the group use at least one of the following sources listed below for the First Lady you have chosen for your research. You may also use the Internet and text sources for your information excluding Wikapedia. After all of the group members have completed their research you will need as a group to decide what you are going to use in the final presentation.
